

The American Physical Society (APS) Division of Physics of Beams (DPB) is pleased to offer a scholarship program to both domestic and international students attending the USPAS. Scholarships in typical amounts of \$500 and possibly higher for those with anticipated higher cost points of travel origin are being offered. Scholarship awardees will be notified at least a month prior to the registration and housing deadline for the USPAS session. Awardees will be recognized on the USPAS website and social media.

Scholarship Description

Travel awards of typically \$500.00 (and higher depending on travel distance and cost). Awards cannot be in excess of actual expenses (receipts are required).

Eligibility

- Candidates must be enrolled as undergraduate or graduate students at an accredited degree-awarding educational institution (US or international)
- Candidates must be members of the APS Division of Physics of Beams (DPB) unit. Note that APS and DPB student membership is free for the first year. Membership enrollment in APS DPB can be found [here](#).
- USPAS scholarship recipients are required to take their USPAS course for credit.

Application Process

Applicants should submit the regular USPAS scholarship materials to the USPAS, and check the “Yes, I am interested in being considered for a DPB scholarship” option, as well as the “Yes, I am a member of the DPB” verification box on the USPAS Application Form.

Criterion for Selection*

Scholarship applications will be evaluated by the DPB Education and Outreach Committee, and will be selected according to the following criterion:

- 1) Aptitude for success in the field of accelerator science and engineering
- 2) Relevance of the USPAS course to career
- 3) Motivation of the student

*Applicants will not be evaluated based on race, gender or ethnicity.
